"NICK" — the Dean of collegiate wrestling coaches — is in his 25th year as head coach at Iowa State. And what a success story! . . . He has developed 16 men who have won a total of 26 NCAA titles; six of his wrestlers have competed in the Olympics, two of them winning gold; he's coached four NCAA championship teams (1965, 1969, 1970, 1972), won two Big Eight crowns, and finished second in the NCAA seven times. A native of Cresco, Iowa, he graduated from Michigan in 1940 as a Big Ten and national champ. A holder of M.S. and Ph.D. degrees, Nick has three times been named Wrestling Coach of the Year and is a member of the Wrestling Hall of Fame. He and his wife, Ruth, have two sons.

LES has got to be the best assistant coach in the nation. He was Harold Nichols' first NCAA champ at Iowa State, winning the 130 pound title in 1958 and the 137 pound division in 1960. Les graduated from Clarion High School in 1955 with three wrestling letters and a state championship. An All-American for three years, he holds a B.S. and M.S. from Iowa State. Les coached four years at Blue Earth, Minn. high school before joining the staff in 1964. He and his wife, Betty, have three children.

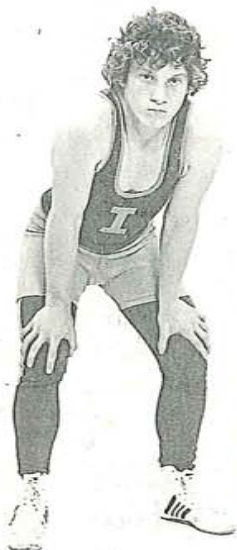

PAUL BARTLETT comes to Cyclone Country from East Lansing High with excellent prep credentials. A Michigan state high school champ his senior year at 112 pounds, Paul's overall prep record was 82-11. A state runner-up his junior year, he was coached by Don Behm, a silver medalist for the U.S. in the 1968 Olympics. Paul Bartlett is also a two-time national junior champ and took a third in the Junior World Tournament in Tokyo in 1971. Last spring, Paul was on a U.S. team that wrestled a touring Japanese squad in the South. Paul's dad is the band and orchestra director at East Lansing High and he's also the golf coach. No wonder, then, that Paul lists golf as one of his favorite sports, shooting in the 80's. The 118 pounder also excels in the classroom, earning honors as a Scholastic All-American with a 3.4 high school average. He's majoring in Landscape Architecture here at Iowa State. Paul's brother, a junior at East Lansing, has gone undefeated on the mat this year.

Cyclone Wrestling Highlights

The Cyclones are setting the stage for another national championship effort with impressive victories in three tournaments and two dual meets so far in the young season. Iowa State easily took its third straight Midlands Tournament championship over the Holidays in Evanston, Ill., racking up a record 108½ points. Oklahoma State was second with 94 points in the meet which drew a record 539 entries. The Cyclones were paced with first place finishes by Bill Fjetland and heavyweight Chris Taylor, who notched four pins and was only seconds away from the quickest pins trophy. Against Mankato State tonight we welcome freshman Tom Jean into the Iowa State lineup at 158 pounds. To accommodate him, John Showalter and Keith Abens have each moved up a weight class. Tom is a three-time Minnesota high school champ, wrestling at Albert Lea High. His brother, Chuck, was a two-time NCAA champ for Iowa State (1969 and 1970). Mankato State is a good college division squad coached by Rummy Macias. Amateur Wrestling News ranked the visitors 16th in the college division in its pre-season picks. Last year, the Cyclones won easily over Mankato, 35-9. Iowa State has never lost in the series, winning 19 times.

SCORING

PART I: INDIVIDUAL MATCH SCORE

- TAKEDOWN** 2 points
 When a wrestler gets behind or on top of his opponent from the neutral or standing position.
- ESCAPE** 1 point
 Getting out from underneath an opponent to a neutral or standing, position—facing him.
- REVERSAL** 2 points
 Getting out from underneath the opponent and behind or on top of him.
- NEAR FALL**
 A near-fall is a position in which the offensive wrestler has control of his opponent in a pinning situation with:
 (1) Both shoulders of the defensive wrestler held momentarily (stopped) within 4 inches of the mat or less, or when one shoulder of the defensive wrestler is touching the mat and the other shoulder is held at an angle of 45 degrees or less with the mat. A continuous roll-through is not to be considered a near-fall 2 points
 (2) The criteria for a near-fall having been met uninterrupted for five seconds. A visual hand count is to be used in determining a three-point near-fall 3 points
- RIDING TIME** 1 point
 At the end of the match 1 point is added to the score of the wrestler who has at least one minute more riding time advantage than his opponent. One point maximum.
- STALLING** First offense, warning
 Second and Third offense, one point; Fourth offense, two points; Fifth offense, disqualify. Stalling is avoiding wrestling in the top, bottom, or neutral position.
- ILLEGAL HOLDS, TECHNICAL VIOLATIONS, ROUGHNESSES** First and second offense, 1 point; Third offense, 2 points; Fourth offense, disqualify.
- WATCH THE REFEREE**
 He Indicates Points As They Are Scored By Holding Up The Fingers Of One Hand.

PART II: "TEAM SCORE"

- PIN OR FALL** 6 points
 To the team whose wrestler holds the shoulders or shoulder blades of the other wrestler in contact with the mat for at least 1 second; this also ends the match.
- SUPERIOR DECISION** 4 points
 Winning a match by 10 points or more.
- DECISION** 3 points
 Awarded to the team whose wrestler scores the most "match points," neither wrestler having secured a fall.
- DRAW** To each team: 2 points
 When both wrestlers have the same number of "match points," neither having secured a fall.
- DEFAULT OR FORFEIT** 6 points
 Awarded to opponents when a wrestler is unable to continue or fails to show up.
